SITE LICENCE AGREEMENT

THIS LICENCE IS AGREED the 18 [date] day of July [month] 2006 [year]

BETWEEN

1. Applied Probability Trust of School of Mathematics & Statistics, University of Sheffield, Sheffield, UK ('the Publisher')

and

WHEREAS the Publisher holds the rights granted under this Licence

AND WHEREAS the Licensee desires to use the rights and the Publisher desires to grant to the Licensee the licence to use the rights for the Fee

IT IS AGREED AS FOLLOWS

1. Key definitions

In the Licence, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

1.1 Authorised users

Current members of the staff of the Licensee (whether on a permanent, temporary, contract or visiting basis), walk in users and individuals who are currently studying at the Licensee's institution, who are permitted to access the Secure Network from within the premises of the Licensee and from such other places where Authorised Users work or study, including, without limitation halls of residence and lodgings and home of Authorised Users, and who have been issued by the Licensee with a password or other authentication.

1.2 Commercial use

Use for the purposes of monetary reward (whether by or for the Licensee or an Authorised User) by means of the sale, resale, loan, transfer, hire or other form of exploitation of the Licensed Materials. For the avoidance of doubt, neither recovery of direct costs by the Licensee from Authorised Users, nor use by the Licensee or by an Authorised User of

the Licensed Material in the course of research funded by a commercial organisation, is deemed to constitute Commercial Use.

1.3 **Fee**

The subscription agreed by the Licensee and the Publisher for access to the Licensed Material

1.4 Library premises

The physical premises of the Library or Libraries operated by the Licensee, as specified in Schedule 1.

1.5 Licensed Material

Publications of the Publisher namely Journal of Applied Probability, Advances in Applied Probability and Special Publications which are made available online and to which the Licensee has a fully paid subscription.

1.6 Course Packs

A collection or compilation of materials (e.g. book chapters, individual journal articles) assembled by members of staff of the Licensee for use by students in a class for the purpose of class instruction in a non-profit, non-commercial basis.

1.7 Subscription period

That period nominally covered by the volumes and issues of the Licensed Material, regardless of the actual date of publication.

1.8 Secure network

A network (whether a standalone network or a virtual network within the Internet), which is only accessible to Authorised Users, approved by the Licensee whose identity is authenticated at the time of login and periodically thereafter consistent with current best practice, and whose conduct is subject to regulation by the Licensee.

<u>Agreement</u>

- 2.1 The Publisher agrees to grant the Licensee the non-exclusive and non-transferable right to give Authorised Users access to the Licensed Material via a Secure Network for the purposes of research, teaching and private study, subject to the terms and conditions of this Licence.
- 2.2 This Licence shall commence at the beginning of the Subscription Period, and remain in effect until terminated
- 2.3 The right specified in sub-Clause 2.1 above is granted in all countries of the world.

3. Permitted uses

- 3.1 The Licensee may, subject to Clause 4 below:
 - 3.1.1 Make such temporary local electronic copies (by means of cacheing) of all or part of the Licensed Material as are necessary provided that such use is subject to all the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
 - 3.1.2 Allow Authorised Users to have access to the Licensed Material, from the Publisher's server or from another server designated by the Publisher via the Secure Network

- 3.1.3 Supply to an Authorised User of another library (whether by post, fax or secure electronic transmission, using Ariel or its equivalent, whereby the electronic file is deleted immediately after printing), for the purposes of research or private study, a single paper copy of an electronic original of an individual document.
- 3.1.4 Incorporate parts of the Licensed Materials in printed educational, non-commercial Course Packs. Materials must be used by Authorised Users in the course of instruction at the Licensee's institution but not for Commercial Use. Each item shall carry appropriate acknowledgment of the source, listing title and author of the extract, title and author of the work, and the publisher. Course Packs in non-electronic non-print perceptible form, such as audio or Braille, may also be offered to Authorised Users who, in the reasonable opinion of the Licensee, are visually impaired. The Licensee shall delete copies of such items for Course Packs when they are no longer used for such purposes.
- 3.2 Authorised Users may, subject to Clause 4 below:
 - 3.2.1 Search, view, retrieve and display the Licensed Material
 - 3.2.2 Electronically temporarily save parts of the Licensed Material for personal use
 - 3.2.3 Print off single copies of parts of the Licensed Material
 - 3.2.4 Provide single copies of parts of the Licensed Material in print or electronic form to other Authorised Users for their personal use.
- 3.3 Nothing in this Licence shall in any way exclude, modify or affect anything the Licensee is allowed to do in respect of any of the Licensed Materials under any statutory rights granted by the Copyright Designs and Patents Act 1988 and any amending legislation.

4. <u>Prohibited uses</u>

- 4.1 Neither the Licensee nor Authorised Users may remove or alter the authors' names or the Publisher's copyright notices or other means of identification or disclaimers as they appear in the Licensed Material.
- 4.2 Neither the Licensee nor Authorised Users may systematically make print or electronic copies of multiple extracts of the Licensed Material for any purpose.
- 4.3 Neither the Licensee nor Authorised Users may provide, by electronic means, to a user at another library or elsewhere, a retained electronic copy of any part of the Licensed Material.
- 4.4 Neither the Licensee nor Authorised Users may mount or distribute any part of the Licensed Material on any electronic network including, without limitation the Internet and the World Wide Web, other than the Secure Network.
- 4.5 The Publisher's explicit written permission must be obtained in order to:
 - 4.5.1 Use the whole or any part of the Licensed Material for any commercial use.

- 4.5.2 Systematically distribute the whole or part of the Licensed Material to anyone other than authorised Users
- 4.5.3 Publish, distribute or make available the Licensed Material, works based on the Licensed Material or works which combine it with any other material, other than as permitted in this Licence.
- 4.5.4 Alter, abridge, adapt or modify the Licensed Material, except to the extent necessary to make it perceptible on a computer screen, or as otherwise permitted in this Licence, to Authorised Users. For the avoidance of doubt, no alteration of the words or their order is permitted.

5. <u>Undertakings</u>

5.1 The Publisher warrants to the Licensee that it is the owner of the copyright in the Licensed Material or that it is duly licensed to use the copyright material contained in the Licensed Material and that the Licensed Material used as contemplated in this Licence does not infringe any copyright or other proprietary or intellectual property rights of any natural or legal person. The Publisher shall indemnify and hold the Licensee harmless from and against any loss, damage, cost, liability or expense (including reasonable legal and professional fees) arising out of any legal action taken against the Licensee claiming actual or alleged infringement of such rights. This indemnity shall not apply if a Licensee has amended the Licensed Material in any way not permitted by this Licence.

5.2 The Publisher shall:

- 5.2.1 Make the Licensed Material available to the Licensee via the Publisher's server or the server of a third party. The Publisher shall notify the Licensee at least sixty (60) days in advance of any anticipated specification change applicable to the Licensed Material.
- 5.2.2 Provide the Licensee, within 30 days of commencement, with information sufficient to enable access to the Licensed Material.
- 5.3 The Publisher reserves the right any time to withdraw from the Licensed Material any item or part of an item for which it no longer retains the right to publish, or which it has reasonable grounds to believe infringes copyright or is defamatory, obscene, unlawful or otherwise objectionable. The Publisher shall give written notice to the Licensee of such withdrawal. If the withdrawn material represents more than ten per cent (10%) of the book, journal or other publication in which it appeared, the Publisher shall make a pro rata refund of part of the Fee, taking into account the amount of material withdrawn and the remaining unexpired portion of the Subscription Period.
- 5.4 The Publisher undertakes either to provide or to make arrangements for a third party to provide an archive of the Licensed Material.
- 5.5 The Licensee shall:

- 5.5.1 Use all reasonable endeavours to ensure that all Authorised Users are appropriately notified of the importance of respecting the intellectual property rights in the Licensed Material and of the sanctions which the Licensee imposes for failing to do so, as specified in Schedule 2.
- 5.5.2 Use all reasonable endeavours to ensure that Authorised Users are made aware of and undertake to abide by the terms and conditions of this Licence; use all reasonable endeavours to monitor compliance and immediately on becoming aware of any unauthorised use or other breach, inform the Publisher and take all reasonable steps, including appropriate disciplinary action, both to ensure that such activity ceases and to prevent any recurrence.
- 5.5.3 Issue passwords or other access information only to Authorised Users and use all reasonable endeavours to ensure that Authorised Users do not divulge their passwords or other access information to any third party.
- 5.5.4 Keep full and up-to-date records of all Authorised Users and their access details.
- 5.5.5 Use all reasonable endeavours to ensure that only Authorised Users are permitted access to the Licensed Material and if appropriate notify the Publisher within a reasonable period of any person ceasing to be an Authorised User.
- 5.6 Nothing in this Licence shall make the Licensee liable for breach of the terms of the Licence by any Authorised User provided that the Licensee did not cause, knowingly assist or condone the continuation of such breach after becoming aware of any actual breach having occurred.
- 5.7 Each party shall use its best endeavours to safeguard the intellectual property, confidential information and proprietary rights of the other party.

6. <u>Termination</u>

- 6.1 This Licence is terminated if either party gives written notice to the other in the following circumstances:
 - 6.1.1 Either party commits a material or persistent breach of any term of this Licence and fails to remedy the breach (if capable of remedy) within thirty days of notification in writing by the other party
 - 6.1.2 Either party becomes insolvent or becomes subject to receivership, liquidation or similar external administration
- 6.2 On termination of this Licence due to breach of any term thereof by the Licensee, the Licensee shall immediately cease to distribute or make available the Licensed Material to Authorised Users.
- 6.3 On termination of this Licence by the Licensee due to breach of any term thereof by the Publisher, the Publisher shall forthwith repay a rateable proportion of the Fee as represents the paid but unexpired part of the Subscription Period.

7. General

- 7.1.1 This Licence may not be assigned by either party to any other person or organisation, nor may either party sub-contract any of its obligations, without the prior written consent of the other party, which consent shall not unreasonably be withheld.
- 7.1.2 If rights in all or any part of the Licensed Material are assigned to another publisher, the Publisher shall use its best endeavours to ensure that the terms and conditions of this Licence are maintained.
- 7.2 Alterations to this Licence are only valid if they are recorded in writing and signed by both parties.
- 7.3 Any notices to be served on either of the parties by the other shall be sent by prepaid recorded delivery or registered post to the address of the addressee as set out in this Licence or to such other address as notified by either party to the other as its address for the service of notices and all such notices shall be deemed to have been received within 14 days of posting.
- 7.4 If any difference shall arise between the parties touching the meaning of this licence or the rights and liabilities of the parties thereto, the same shall in the first instance be referred to an independent expert agreed by the parties or, in default of such agreement, nominated by the President for the time being of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales. Such expert shall act as expert and not as an arbitrator, and the expert's decision (which shall be given in writing stating the reasons therefore) shall be final and binding on the parties. Each party shall provide the expert with such information as the expert may reasonably require for the purposes of determination. The costs of the expert shall be borne by the parties in such proportions as the expert may determine to be fair and reasonable or, if no such determination is made, in equal proportions.
- 7.5 Neither party shall be liable in any way for failure or delay in performing its obligations under this Licence if the failure or delay is due to causes outside the reasonable control of the party in default.
- 7.6 The failure of any party to enforce any provision on any one occasion shall not affect its right to enforce another provision or the same provision on another occasion.
- 7.7 In the event that any provision of this Licence is held to be invalid, the remainder of the provisions shall continue in full force and effect.
- 7.8 This Licence shall be governed by and construed according to the laws of England and the parties irrevocably agree to submit to the jurisdiction of the English courts.
